

Travelling to the UK

How to get to WLES

Our school is in <u>Ealing Broadway</u>. From Heathrow to WLES, it takes less than 40 minutes by public transport. We are a 10-minute walk from the station.

<u>Travelling by Eurostar</u>

If you are travelling to the UK by Eurostar, you will arrive at <u>St. Pancras Station</u>. From St. Pancras Station, take the Piccadilly Line to South Ealing and change to a bus going towards Ealing Broadway, stopping at <u>Ealing Christchurch</u>.



Entering the UK

If you are visiting the UK by yourself, you will need to prepare the following documents:

- Valid passport
- School acceptance letter/registration letter
- Visa (if applicable)
- Written consent from your parents allowing you to travel alone
- Accommodation and contact details in the UK

Arriving on your First Day & Course Information

Arriving at your homestay

When you arrive, you'll stay with a carefully chosen host family. Here's what you need to know:

Homestay Details

- Address: We will send this to you before you arrive in the UK.
- Contact details: We will send these to you before you arrive in the UK. You are welcome to send an email to introduce yourself to your host family before you arrive!

House Rules

- Respect: Be respectful of the host family's home, privacy, and belongings.
- Communication: Communicate honestly with your host family during your time in London.



- Always return to your homestay before curfew time. If you're not sure what this is, check with your homestay host, who has decided this information with your parents/guardians. The homestay host has the final say in curfew times.
- Exchange numbers with your homestay when you arrive.
- Always let your homestay know if you are not going to be home for dinner.
- You will need the school's, homestay host's and your parents' permission to stay out after curfew time.
- Save your homestay hosts address in <u>Google Maps</u> and on the <u>CityMapper app</u>. It can be very easy to get lost in London and you need to know where you live.

The best way to improve your English during your stay with us is to spend time with your host family and immerse yourself in British culture and experience the English way of life.

First Day

You will need to arrive at the school at 08:45 on the first day of your course, and wait until one of our members of staff tells you who your teacher is and where your classroom is.

To save time, you can do this before arriving.



Lunch at School

Students who are joining both morning and afternoon sessions, will have 55 minutes for lunch.

Lunch Options:

- 1. Packed Lunch: Prepared by your host family or relative. You will have access to the kitchen/cafeteria to enjoy your packed lunch or buy food from the cafeteria.
- 2. Local Restaurants and Cafés: If you don't bring a packed lunch, your parents can give permission for you to get lunch from nearby restaurants or food stalls, which you can find within a few minutes' walking distance from the school. Depending on where you go, lunch can cost between £5 and £15.
- 3. Canteen at the school, which also includes vending machines: (Only available in July and August)

Social Programme (Afternoon activities)

We offer a number of activities throughout the summer, including Exploring London, Business English Skills, Football English lessons, STEM programme, and Drama Class. Please speak to our staff if you are not sure which activity you will be attending. Always make sure you have some money or a valid payment card with you.

Travelling Around London

You can use an <u>Oyster card</u> on public transport, including Underground (Tube), buses, trains, trams, Thames Clippers (boats), and Emirates Airline (cable cars). You can purchase an Oyster card at any Tube station or London visitor centre.

If you don't have an Oyster card, you can also use a credit card, debit card, or Travelcard. A 7-day travel card costs £47.90 and can be purchased at visitor centres.

School Rules

Behaviour Expectations

- Attend classes every day and arrive on time.
- Inform the school if you are unable to attend class due to illness or other reasons as soon as possible.
- Notify the school promptly of any changes to your address or contact details.
- Show politeness and respect when interacting with fellow students, staff, and accommodation providers.
- Understand that bullying or harassment, whether online or in person, is not acceptable and can result in dismissal.



- Respect important British values such as democracy, rule of law, individual liberty, and respect for others' faiths and beliefs.
- Wear your lanyards at all times.
- Try to communicate in English as much as possible.
- During class, mobile devices must be set to silent mode and stored away. Their
 use is permitted only when directly contributing to your learning as allowed by
 your teacher.

Digital Behaviour

- Do not add strangers on social media.
- Do not share your personal information online.
- Speak to your teacher or any staff at the school if you receive any text or pictures that make you uncomfortable.
- Check <u>CEOP</u> for more information about online safety.

Things You Shouldn't Do

- No smoking, drinking alcohol, using drugs, stealing, or shoplifting.
- Do not use offensive language or engage in fights.
- Do not use your mobile phone or any handheld equipment during lessons or activities.
- Do not break any laws.
- Do not chew gum in class.



Health and Safety

1. Emergency Procedures

- Familiarise yourself with emergency exit routes and assembly points in case of fire or other emergencies.
- Report any safety hazards immediately to a staff member. Everyone's responsible for our safety.
- Follow instructions from school staff or emergency services during drills and real emergencies.

2. First Aid

- Report any injuries or illnesses to a staff member as soon as possible.
- Trained staff members are available to provide first aid assistance.
- Familiarise yourself with the location of first aid kits on the school premises.

Healthcare Services

• In case of a medical emergency, dial 112 or 999 for an ambulance or seek help from a staff member.

3. Personal Safety

- Be aware of your surroundings and avoid risky situations.
- Travel with a friend or in groups, especially at night.
- Trust your instincts and report any concerns to school staff or authorities.
- Keep your personal belongings, such as your wallet, phone, and passport, in sight. If your phone gets stolen, call 101 or 0870 1123 123. You will need your IMEI number, a 15-digit serial number, to report a stolen mobile phone. You can find this number by dialling #06# on most mobile phones or in the Settings section under About. If you need assistance, our safeguarding team is here to help you. Remember to keep your IMEI number written down somewhere safe, just in case you need it.
- Avoid talking to strangers on the street.




4. Accommodation Safety

- Keep your living space tidy and free of hazards.
- Report any safety concerns in your accommodation to your homestay family or our accommodation host.

5. General Safety Precautions

- Follow all safety instructions during school activities and excursions.
- Wear appropriate safety gear when participating in sports or outdoor activities.
- Treat others with respect and kindness and report any instances of bullying or harassment.
- Wearing facemasks is your choice. COVID restrictions don't currently apply in the UK.

6. School Floor Plan & Fire Exit Map



To help you navigate the school and stay safe during your time with us, please study the floor plan below. It shows the key locations within the school, including:

• Fire exits – clearly marked with green symbols



- Toilets labelled for boys and girls use
- Classrooms where your lessons take place
- Offices staff areas

In the event of a fire alarm:

- 1. Stop what you are doing and leave the building immediately using the nearest fire exit.
- 2. Do not collect personal belongings or use the lift.
- 3. Walk calmly to the fire assembly point (your teacher will tell you where this is on your first day).
- 4. Wait quietly while staff take attendance.
- 5. Only return to the building when you are told it is safe to do so.

Smoking

Do not smoke anywhere on the school premises, including electronic cigarettes. Smoking is prohibited indoors in the UK, and it is illegal for people under the age of 18 to buy nicotine products, including cigarettes and e-cigarettes (vapes).

Drugs and Alcohol

Using drugs is illegal in the UK and drinking alcohol is not permitted for people under the age of 18. Students cannot be under the influence of drugs or alcohol at any point during their stay in the UK. It's important to know UK drug laws while you are here.





West London English School Code of Conduct for Under 18 Students

1. Be Kind and Respectful:

- Attend classes regularly and engage in learning activities.

- Come to class prepared to learn.
- Do your own work and tell the truth.
- Do not engage in any form of academic dishonesty, including plagiarism and cheating.

- Maintain appropriate behaviour both within the classroom, and outside the classroom.
- Use electronic devices responsibly and in accordance with teacher instructions.



6. Personal Responsibility:

- Show professionalism by following the dress code and keeping good personal hygiene.
- Take care of your belongings and keep the school clean.

7. Recognising Consequences:

- Understand that breaking school rules may lead to disciplinary actions.
- Work with school staff and accept responsibility for any misconduct.

8. Promoting Positivity:

- Uphold a positive image of the school in all interactions, both within and beyond the school community.
- Show kindness and respect towards others in all settings.
